- Losar – New Year celebration



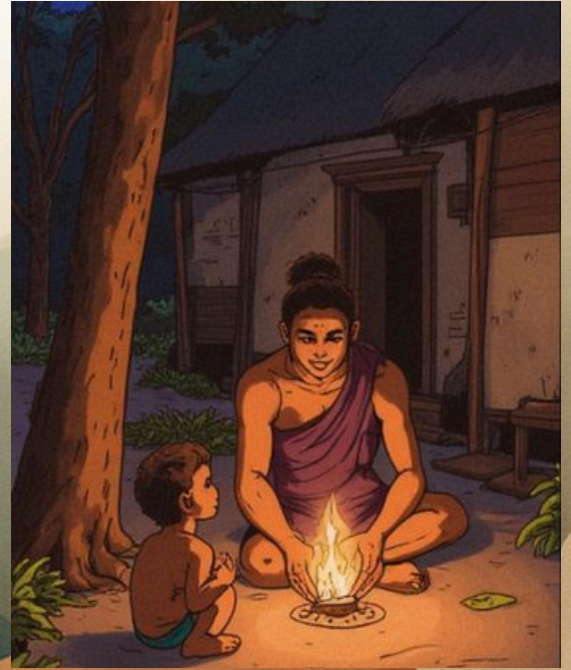
Music, dance, rituals, and shared meals define these celebrations.

Oral tradition keeps culture alive without written books.

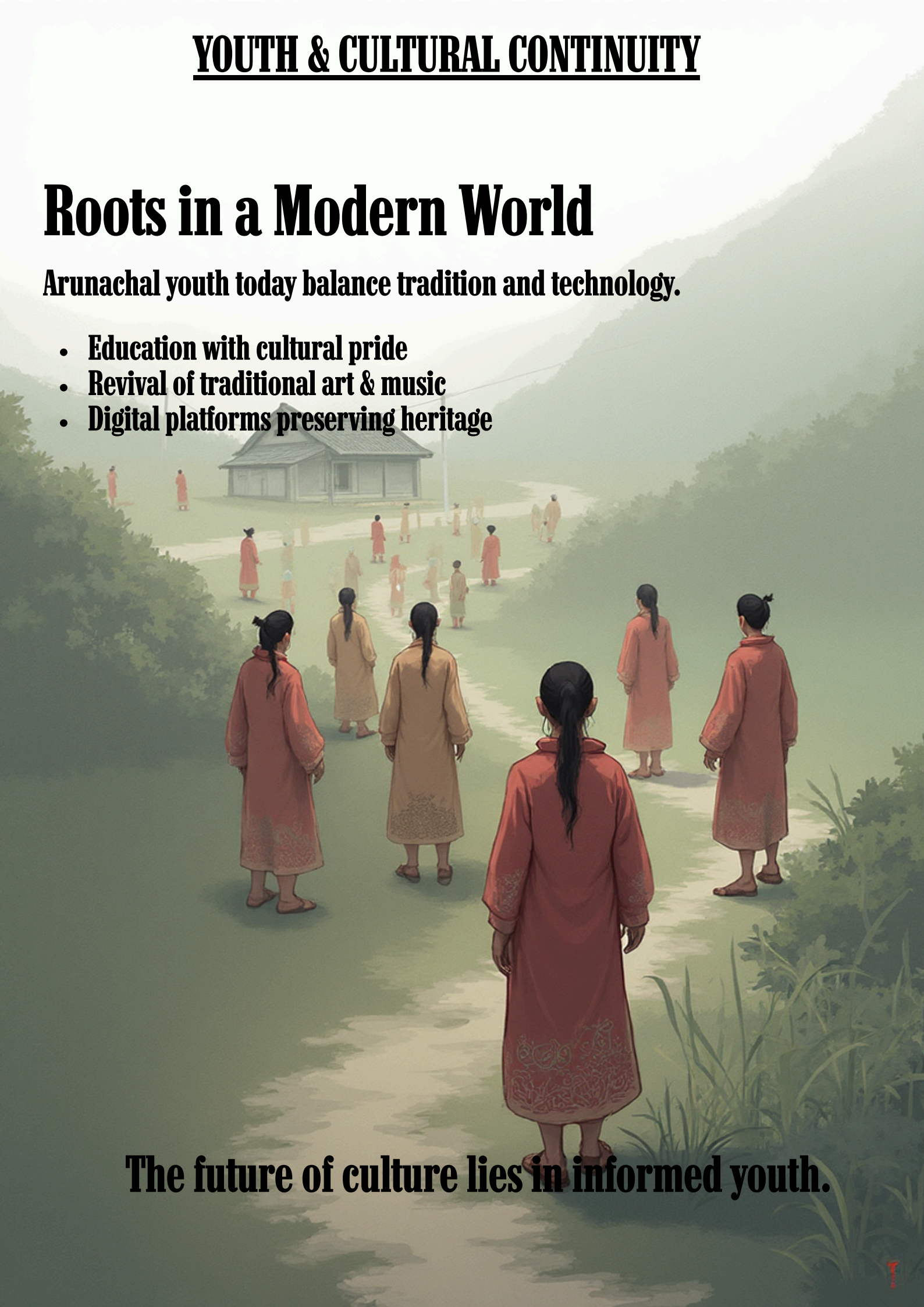
